Rationalization	It's how the suspect justifies their wrongdoing. The rationalization to commit fraud is the most difficult to observe.	Fraud Triangle
Moral relativism	Moral judgments are true or false only relative to some particular standpoint and that no standpoint is uniquely privileged over all others.	Ethics Model
Utilitarianism	It prescribes actions that maximize happiness and well-being for all affected individuals.	Ethics Model
Moral absolutism	All actions are intrinsically right or wrong regardless of contexts or situations.	Ethics Model
